The Chairmar welcomed all the members.

**Sub. No. 266:** To read and record proceedings of the 32<sup>nd</sup> Academic Council Meeting (Online) held on 28.8.2021 & Action Taken Report.

The Chairman briefed about the proceedings of 32<sup>nd</sup> Academic Council Meeting held on 28.7.2022 and Action Taken Report thereon. Since no comments were raised. The proceedings and action taken report were read and recorded.

**Sub. No. 267:** Information on the activities of RVCE.

The Chairmar highlighted on institution activities carried out through a presentation. The external experts congratulated and appreciated the institution, faculty and staff for the excellent work.

Dr. Kori suggested to explore the feasibility of conducting virtual lab. Sessions in all the departments.

Dr. Prabhakara suggested that ISE dept. could look at inclusion of CCNA in Skill Lab. for students.

The Chairmar also briefed the Council that RVCE has presented a poster during the IUCEE Annual Summit held at Goa from 8<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> July 2022 and it was very well appreciated by all the participants.

**Sub. No. 269** Discussion on Scheme of V to VIII Sem. B.E. programs of 2021 scheme.

Chairpersons of various departments explained the scheme of III to VIII Sem. B.E programs of 2021 scheme.

Dr. Prabhakara enquired is there any restriction on students to join for Sports, NSS, NCC as per VTU.

Following are the suggestions made by the external experts.

- a) **UHV-2:** credit to be changed.
- b) **Mathematics:** Prof. Shivananda suggested to include Applied and Classic Mathematics in 4<sup>th</sup> sem. Scheme. Dr. Kori suggested to rename Statistics & Probability for Data Science to Statistics and Probability for Data Analysis. He also suggested Linear Algebra basic concepts to be included in all branches.
- c) **AI & ML** Prof. Shivananda sought distinguish between Computer Science & Engineering and AI&ML. The Chair nan briefed that 70% courses are common in both programs, remaining 30% pertaining to specific program.
- d) **ASE:** Dr. Kori suggested to change the title of Global G Elective – Optical Fibre Communication, which matches exactly to Aerospace Engineering course.  
The Chairnan opined that clustering of electives to be looked into and pre-requisites to be looked into while framing the syllabus.  
The members also opined that local elective to be changed to Departmental Elective.
- e) **BT:** External experts opined that Design and Instrumentation courses to be included in the program.
- f) **CH:** IoT enabled courses to be included.
- g) **CSE:** Dr. Prabhakara suggested to include Project Management and Financial Management in the curriculum.
- h) **EC,EE,ET,EI:** Dr. Kori & Dr. Prabhakara suggested to accommodate Microwave & Antennas in the curriculum.
- i) **EE:** Data structures to be moved as Electives and to include E-mobility in Core course.
- j) **EIE:** Dr. Kori suggested to change the course title Printed Circuit Boards as Digital Humanities, which can be offered to all departments.

**Resolution:** After a detailed discussion, the Council approved the scheme of II year B.E. programs of 2021 scheme.

**Sub. No. 270** To approve the academic guidelines for 2021 scheme, as per the new VTU regulations.

The Chairman briefed the academic guidelines for 2021 scheme, as per the new VTU regulations through a presentation.

### ACADEMIC PLANNING

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- The curriculum is designed as per the Outcome Based Education (OBE) and shall include General Engineering courses, Basic Science, Humanity & Social Sciences, Core Professional Engineering, Professional Electives and Global (Open) Electives and Minor/Major Project works & Internships.
- Individual Board of Studies (BoS) for each department takes care of formation of Scheme and Syllabus. The same is approved by the Academic Council (AC) of the Institution. There shall be an equal emphasis on theory, practical / laboratory and workshops. **Emphasis is also given for Self-study & Experiential Learning.**
- All students have to undergo Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) which includes **TESTS, QUIZZES & EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING**. At the end of the semester, eligible students have to take Semester End Examination (SEE) for both theory and practical as per the scheme.
- Students declared as Not Satisfied Attendance Requirements (NSAR) (In 2021 Guidelines it is termed as Not eligible-NE) or Not Satisfied Sessional Requirements (NSSR) (now termed as Not eligible-NE) are not eligible to take up Semester End Examination (SEE) in that particular Course including laboratory, if any.

**SEMESTER REGISTRATION (MANDATORY)**  
Every student has to register in person at the beginning of every semester as per the notification issued by the office of the Dean Academics from time to time. Such students who do not register within **ONE WEEK** from the date of commencement of the semester, shall not be eligible to take up that particular semester.

### DROPPING OF COURSES

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- DROPPING OF THE COURSE:**
  - A student can drop a course under the guidance of the counsellor/HoD/DA within the specified period as mentioned in the Academic Calendar, normally in the beginning of any semester, **WITHIN THREE WEEKS**.
  - The total credits **SHOULD NOT FALL SHORT OF 16 (SIXTEEN) CREDITS** which are the minimum number of credits to be registered per semester.
  - STUDENT HAS TO RE-REGISTER FOR THAT COURSE AFTER VII SEMESTER OF THE PROGRAM.**
  - The dropped courses are not recorded in the Grade Card & will not be considered as an attempt.

**Note:**

- If a candidate drops a course, then, that particular course has to be taken up only in regular semester but not in Supplementary semester.
- THIS FACILITY IS NOT APPLICABLE FOR FIRST YEAR STUDENTS.**

### WITHDRAWAL OF COURSES

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- A student may opt to withdraw from a course on or before the date specified (**USUALLY ONE MONTH BEFORE THE END OF SEMESTER**) as per the calendar of events.
- Students have to submit an application through the HoD to Dean Academics, in consultation with HoD, Counsellor & the parent.
- The candidate should have fulfilled the attendance criteria (for the course/s that he/she wants to withdraw). The withdrawn course(s) are recorded in the Grade Card as **'W' GRADE. W GRADE IS TREATED AS AN ATTEMPT**. However, such withdrawals will be permitted without prejudice to the minimum number of credits as specified in rule book.
- Students, who have been declared **'W'** grade have to re-register during supplementary semester and earn both attendance & CIE and clear Semester End Examination.
- THIS FACILITY IS NOT APPLICABLE FOR FIRST YEAR STUDENTS.**

### ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT

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- It is mandatory to obtain attendance **minimum of 85%** in each course with a provision for condonation of 10% of the attendance by the Principal, RVCE for genuine reasons such as (i) **serious medical condition** or (ii) **representing the Institute / University / State / Nation in sports, cultural, technical or academic activity** with the permission of the Principal.
- Even in such cases, a minimum of 75% attendance is absolutely mandatory.**

### TEMPORARY BREAK OF STUDY FROM THE PROGRAM

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- A student shall be permitted to withdraw temporarily from the program in the middle of the semester for valid reasons and wants to re-join the program later in respective semester, he/she shall apply for it with the permission from Dean Academics & the Principal, RVCE well in advance.
- Such application shall be submitted within **at least 6 weeks** of the commencement of the semester.
- If any candidate is detained for any reason, the period of detention shall not be considered as **'Break of Study'**.

### CREDITS REQUIREMENT FOR BE PROGRAM

### INTERNAL ASSESSMENT & EVALUATION

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- Assessment testing is done in two Components: **CIE & SEE.**
- CIE and SEE will have **EQUAL (50-50) WEIGHTAGE.**
- A student's performance in a course is judged by considering the performance in both CIE and SEE.
- An average course load of 22 credits per semester with its **minimum and maximum limits being fixed at 16 and 28 credits** respectively will be followed as per the recommendation of BoS and Academic Council.

**GRADING SYSTEM**

Absolute Grading system on 10-point scale is followed in the evaluation of student's performance in a course.

- **LETTER GRADES:** Letter grade is basically a qualitative measure (an alphabet/letter) giving the performance of a student, such as, Outstanding (O), Excellent (A+), Very Good (A), Good (B+), Above Average (B), Average (C), Pass (P) and Fail (F). This is arrived at after the student's performance in a course, which includes both CIE and SEE.

**GRADE POINTS:** Depending on the letter grades assigned, a student earns certain grade points. In the 10-point grading system, that is followed, the grade points earned for different letter grades are mentioned above.

- Note: Institution is examining the introduction of Relative Grading System in due course

**ELIGIBILITY FOR MAKE UP EXAMS**

- **GRADE T:** Awarded to a student having satisfactory attendance at classes and meeting the passing standard at CIE in a course but remained absent from SEE for valid and convincing reasons as given in the Rule Book.
- **GRADE X:** Awarded to a student having attendance (> = 85%) and CIE rating (> = 90%) in a course, but SEE performance observed to be 'F', which could result in an overall F grade in the course.

**EARNING CREDIT:** A Student would be considered to have completed a course successfully and earned the credits, if he/she secures a letter grade other than NE, MP, I, W, X or F in that course.

**GRADE F IN ANY COURSE IMPLIES FAILURE IN THAT COURSE.**

**SUPPLEMENTARY SEMESTER****SCHEDULE OF SUPPLEMENTARY SEMESTER:**

- A student of UG program of 2021 scheme will have opportunity to register for supplementary semester which is offered after
  - IV semester &
  - VIII semester.
- For registering to supplementary semester, the student should complete the Internship/s as notified in the university Regulations/ directions.

**REGISTRATION FOR SUPPLEMENTARY****REGISTRATION FOR SUPPLEMENTARY/ FAST TRACK SEMESTER:**

- The course/s for which the student does not possess satisfactory attendance/ CIE score, shall be marked as **NE** in the Grade sheet.
- Such students are not permitted for regular SEE for the courses marked as NE in Grade Sheet.
- The students have to re-register only for course/s marked as NE in supplementary/ subsequent semester whenever that course is offered and obtain the required CIE and attendance. Subsequently, they are eligible to appear for SEE in such course/s.
- Candidates, who have been declared as "W" for the courses, are also eligible to register in supplementary semester.
- A student is permitted to register for a maximum of 16 credits or maximum of FIVE Courses in supplementary/ fast track semester, not more than TWO courses with lab.

**PASSING STANDARDS**

- The Standard of passing in each course is given in the following Table

Passing Standard for Theory Course	CIE > = 40% and SEE > = 35% Aggregate 40%
Passing Standard for Laboratory Project work	CIE > = 40% and SEE > = 35% Aggregate 40%
Passing Standard for courses having both Theory and laboratory components	CIE Theory > = 40%, Lab > = 40% SEE Theory > = 35%, Lab > = 35% and aggregate of > = 40% (Theory and Lab together)

- There shall be no re-examination for any course in the credit system to take care of such students.

- Who have absented themselves from attending CIE or SEE without any valid reason;
- Who have failed (Grade F) to meet the minimum passing standard prescribed for CIE and / or SEE;
- Who have been detained for shortage of attendance in any course work;
- Who have withdrawn (Grade W) from a course.

Such students shall be required to re-register for the course(s) and go through CIE and SEE again and obtain a Grade F or better grades in each case. While such students shall have to re-register for the same course(s) if hard core, they can re-register for alternative course(s) from the soft core or elective courses, as the case may be. The re-registration shall be possible only when the particular course is offered again either in a main (Odd/Even) or a supplementary semester.

**SUCCESSIVE FAILURES:** If a student fails to pass a course even after FOUR ATTEMPTS, that course is deemed to be exempted for him/her. The respective Roll may suggest an alternative course with same credits and complexity.

**GRADE POINT AVERAGES SGPA AND CGPA**

The grade points earned for each course are used further for calculating semester grade point average (SGPA) and the cumulative grade point average (CGPA), both of which being important performance indices of the student.

- **SGPA** (Semester Grade Point Average) is the performance index of a student in a semester and is calculated as follows:

$$SGPA = \frac{\sum (\text{Course Credits}) \times (\text{Grade Point}) \text{ for all the courses registered by the student, excluding transitional grades in that semester}}{\sum (\text{Course Credits}) \text{ for all the courses registered by the student, excluding transitional grades in that semester}}$$

- **CGPA** (Cumulative Grade Point Average) is the performance index of a student of all the previous semesters and is calculated as follows:

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum (\text{Course Credits}) \times (\text{Grade Point}) \text{ for all the courses registered by the student, excluding F grades until that semester}}{\sum (\text{Course Credits}) \text{ for all the courses registered by the student, excluding F grades in that semester}}$$

**MAKE UP EXAMS**

- Make-up examination facility is available to those students who have missed SEE in one or more courses in a semester and has been declared with a sufficient justification as 'T' grade.
- Students having 'X' grade shall also be eligible to take advantage of this facility. The make-up examination would be held as per dates notified by the Controller of Examinations normally immediately 10 days after the announcement of the results.
- **THERE SHALL BE NO MAKE-UP EXAMINATION FOR SUPPLEMENTARY/ FAST TRACK SEMESTER.**
- In case where the student fails to take make-up examination, the actual grade obtained in the regular examination will be considered as the final grade in the course ('F' grade in case of 'X' grade and 'Ab' in case of 'T' grade in SEE).
- **NO MAKE-UP EXAMINATION WILL BE APPLICABLE FOR ONLINE MOOC COURSES.**

**CONDITIONS FOR VERTICAL PROGRESSION**

- The students who have satisfied CIE and Attendance requirements for the course/s and obtained F grade in SEE are permitted to appear directly in SEE examination/s as backlog paper/s in subsequent semester.
- The students need not re-register for such course/s in the supplementary/ fast track semester.
- Such students need not earn Attendance and CIE once again.

**SUMMARY OF VERTICAL PROGRESSION****FIRST YEAR:**

1. More than 4 F Grades (including NE and MP) not permitted to move to III Sem; (F and NE/MP merged)

**SECOND YEAR:**

1. From II year onwards **P and NE separated; (NE-Attn) & (NE-CIE);**
2. At the end of even Sem (IV & VI) In case, if the candidate declares **NE-Attn in MORE THAN 4 COURSES**, then the candidate is not allowed to move forward from **EVEN TO ODD SEMESTER** (V and VII Sem);
3. **ANY NUMBER OF F'S ARE PERMITTED TO CARRY FROM III TO VIII SEM;**

**FOURTH YEAR:**

1. Before entering to VII sem, all the I Year courses should be cleared;
2. Maintain > = 5.00 CGPA before the award of B.E. degree;
3. Degree should be completed by 8 years (regular) or 6 years (for lateral entry);

**Assessment for MOOC courses**

**ONLINE MOOC COURSES:**

- The candidate obtaining "F" grade in MOOC course have to re-register for the course in NPTEL/SWAYAM platform only. The failed course has to be cleared / passed in ONLINE mode only. /
- The candidate is permitted to change the MOOC course in his second attempt. The respective BoS may suggest an alternative course with same credits and complexity out of bunch of courses with the approval from the Office of Dean Academics.
- The candidate has to register and complete the course in **ONLINE MODE ONLY**.

**Summary for Change in Course**

- If a student fails to pass a course even after **FOUR ATTEMPTS**, may opt for changing the course in the next attempt. The respective BoS may suggest an alternative course with same credits and complexity.
- The candidate is permitted to change the **PROFESSION ELECTIVE COURSE** in his **SECOND ATTEMPT**.
- The candidate is permitted to change the **MOOC course** in his **SECOND ATTEMPT**.

**Resolution:** The Council endorsed its approval for examination rules and regulations of 2021 scheme.

**Sub. No. 273: To approve nomination of Board of Studies Members of various programs, for the term 2022-2024.**

The Chairman briefed that the term of Council nominated members for Board of Studies of various departments has completed. The departments have taken concurrence from external experts to be nominated in the Board of Studies of respective departments for the academic year 2022-2024.

**Resolution:** The council endorsed its approval of external experts for Board of Studies of various departments for the term 2022-2024.

**Sub. No. 274: To consider one grace credit for B.E. Honours students**

The Chairman briefed that, as per NPTEL recommendation, one extra credit may be considered for those students who have earned 17 out of 18 credits towards getting B.E. Honours Degree.

**Resolution:** The Council endorsed its approval to consider once grace credit for B.E. Honours students.

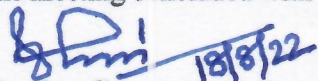
**Sub. No. 275: Approval for conduction of 12<sup>th</sup> Graduation Day on 27<sup>th</sup> Aug. 2022.**

The Chairman briefed that due to the Pandemic situation the college could not hold offline graduation day in 2020 & 2021. It is proposed to hold the 12<sup>th</sup> Graduation Day on 27<sup>th</sup> Aug. 2022. Prof. M.P. Poonia, Vice Chairman-AICTE, will be the Chief Guest and deliver the graduation day address and Sri. Ramamurthy, Chairman, CMR University, has accepted our invitation to deliver the inaugural address. We will convene one more Council Meeting during 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> week of August, to take formal approval for the graduating students.

The Controller of Examinations briefed that some students have given representation to issue the Provisional Degree Certificate before the convocation, as they need to submit the PDC for higher studies abroad. Hence, sought permission from the Council to issue PDC to only such exceptional cases.

**Resolution:** The council approved to conduct Graduation Day on 27<sup>th</sup> Aug. 2022 and endorsed its approval to issue PDC to exceptional cases, before the graduation day.
