Around 90 companies visited RVCE this season and picked 1,073 students till date. The highest offer for this college last year was Rs 30 lakh.

ferred Rs 24 lakh by startup Code Nation, said, "I'm lucky. I never thought I'd be selected in my first interview." KS Sridhar, dean (placements) of PESIT, said Mukund's pay package is a college record.

Jobs pouring in: Around 100 companies made offers to 962 PESIT students. At MS Ramaiah Institute of Technology (MSRIT), an IS

student has been offered Rs 18.5 lakh by a professional networking site.

With 1,529 students getting offers from 139 companies, MSRIT appears to have got the highest number of offers among colleges in the city till date this season.

Of the 1,529 students, 1,278 students were selected in the first 18 days of the placement drive in MSRIT. Savitha Konna M, head (training and placement) of MSRIT, said, "For the first time, so many students were selected during the winter campus interview. We are expecting a good response during summer too."

The fat salary packages have perked up the mood in the otherwise-staid University Visvesvaraya College of

Engineering (UVCE). H Shashank Koppar, an IS student of UVCE, has been offered Rs 19.5 lakh by Rakuten, a Japanese e-commerce giant. Shashank, from Rairchur, said, "I'm excited about working in Tokyo. I'll start work on Sept 1, 2015."

Shashank is the first student to get such huge salary package in UVCE since its inception in 1917.

College principal KR Venugopal said 54 companies have so far made 770 offers to 330 students, and 40 more companies are expected to come to the campus by the month end.

Last year, a UVCE student had bagged a Rs 16-lakh offer from Microsoft. UVCE is the only government engineering college in Bengaluru.
