
NSS Activities in the year 2021-22




NSS Activities in the year 2020-21

- NSS RVCE conducted a webinar on occasion of World Environment Day 2020 with the theme "Biodiversity" Time for Nature, to instill a responsible commitment towards the resourceful mother earth.
- On the occasion of the 151st Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi and Rashtriya Swachhta Diwas, NSS RVCE organised a first of its kind 'Regard before Discard' event to encourage the principle of Reduce, Reuse and Recycle. As a part of this event the Volunteers were asked to make creative art works out of discarded items or materials.
- NSS RVCE supported Vidya Bharati Akhil Bharatiya Shiksha Sanstha in spreading awareness about the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, through various national level competitions, being conducted in 13 Indian languages.

 There were multiple competitions to spread awareness on Road Safety, like Ad Mad, Poster Making, Street Play, Idea Pitching etc.

- NSS RVCE was a part of Pre Republic-Day Camp selection. By attending the RD Camp, the volunteers become capable of adopting a good life style like they learn group living, attain leadership quality, improve communication skills, come forward to undertake any responsibilities and fulfil them.

NCC ACTIVITIES OF THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2020-21

Annual Report

On October 2009, with the sanctioned cadet strength, NCC RVCE was started with the ideals to impart Patriotism, Discipline and Adventure among the engineering graduate students which constitutes a valuable, vital asset of our nation and to promote their responsibilities in nation-building. Our unit functioned successfully with cadets. During this academic year 2020 -2021, 27 of our NCC Cadets have been awarded NCC B-Certificate & 30 of our NCC Cadets have been awarded NCC C- Certificate. In this maiden year, our cadets actively participated in various NCC activities and training programs. The detailed activities for the academic year 2020-2021 are submitted here.

ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED FOR THE NCC CADETS IN THIS YEAR....

*** VACCINATION DRIVE**

The Vaccination drive was preceded under ANO Capt. Dr Mahendra Kumar S aimed at vaccinating as many residents as possible. Three such vaccination drives took place on 21st June 2021, 5th July 2021 and 17th September 2021, respectively. These vaccination drives had 7 SDs and 9 SWs from 3rd-year cadets and 8 SDs and 6 SWs from 2nd-year cadets. Registration booths were set up for a week and volunteers were chosen to help the residents to register themselves into the Aarogya Setu app. Around 1500 and 1050 people were vaccinated during the first and the second vaccination drives respectively, following which the third vaccination drive was conducted.

* HASIRU - TREE PLANTATION DRIVE

- 1. The first plantation drive that preceded online mode, under ANO Capt. Dr Mahendra Kumar S, was conducted on 12th June 2021, which consisted of 7 SDs from 3rd-year cadets and 11 SDs and 3 SWs from 2nd-year cadets. This programme aimed at planting at least 385 trees in the Honour of Padma Shri Saalu Marada Thimakka, and spreading awareness and knowledge through various platforms.
- 2. The second plantation drive, which preceded on offline mode, under ANO Capt. Dr Mahendra Kumar S, was conducted on 5th July 2021, which consisted of 18 SDs

- and 10 SWs from 3rd-year cadets and 14 SDs and 13 SWs from 2nd-year cadets. This programme aimed at providing seeds of beneficial trees among the common people, and so far, around 180 people have received these seeds.
- 3. The Hasiru plantation drive (Devanahalli), that preceded under ANO Capt. Dr Mahendra Kumar S in collaboration with the Scouts and Guides and the Youth and Sports association, Devanahalli, was conducted on 28th November 2021, which consisted of 16 SDs and 10 SDs from 3rd-year cadets and 9 SDs and 7 SWs from 2nd-year cadets. Under this, all the cadets successfully planted at least one sapling and completed a 5 km walkathon, holding the posters to create awareness on the reduction of plastic wastes and on tree plantation.

*** FITNESS FOR LIFE**

This online fitness program, that preceded ANO Capt. Dr Mahendra Kumar S, was conducted from 3rd May 2021 to 17th July 2021, which consisted of 18 SDs and 12 SDs from 3rd-year cadets and 14 SDs and 13 SWs from 2nd-year cadets. Under this program, over 300 participants attended the program enthusiastically for about 62 days, with the motivation to keep themselves fit against the COVID-19 infection, along with following the Yoga sessions regularly.

❖ ARTICLES, DRAWINGS AND OTHER WORKS FOR NCC DIGITAL FORUM

Under these extra-curricular activities, about 112 articles, 40 drawings, 26 poems and 6 videos were prepared by the NCC cadets.
